### For the Secondary Category

#### Frequently Asked Questions:

♦ **When does the competition open?**

The competition officially opens on Wednesday 21st February 2018.

♦ **When do we have to get the film back to Childnet?**

The cut off for entrants is 17:00 GMT on Monday 11th June 2018. Any films received after this date won't be considered.

♦ **When will we find out if we've made it to the finalists' event?**

All finalists will be revealed on Monday 18th June 2018.

♦ **When will the event for the finalists be?**

The private screening event will be held in London on Tuesday 3rd July 2018.

♦ **How long can my film be?**

Only entries of **2 minutes** or under can be considered for the Secondary category. This time frame must include any credits you wish to add. It is advisable to keep credits to a minimum to avoid losing time for your film content and remember to add first names only!

♦ **How many can be in a group?**

Each group should contain between 2 and 8 people, including those behind the scenes.

♦ **What if someone would like to make a film by themselves at home?**

Sorry but we are unable to accept individual entries as all entries need to be a team effort as this is a school/youth project.

♦ **How many entries can be submitted from one school/youth group?**

There is no limit, we would love everyone in your school/youth group to have the opportunity to be involved.

♦ **What equipment should I use?**

All schools/youth groups have different facilities and access to equipment. You could use anything from a camcorder to a mobile phone. It's the fantastic content that we will be looking for!

♦ **How do I send you my film?**

Completed films should be sent to **Childnet International, Studio 14, Brockley Cross Business Centre, 96 Endwell Road, London, SE4 2PD** and must be submitted on a DVD/ USB or electronically (eg Dropbox or WeTransfer) to [film@childnet.com](mailto:film@childnet.com) no later than 5pm on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2018.

♦ **Do I need permission?**

Yes, your teacher or youth leader should have registered you and will act as your mentor throughout the competition. They will also be responsible for entering your film into the competition. When submitting your film **make sure you have media consent from all the people in your film** (see the media consent form in your starter packs) – otherwise we won't be able to put it on our website or be able to show it at the finalist private screening.

♦ **What If I want to add music?**

We can only accept films that contain original or royalty free music. Make sure that you have read our section on copyright before you include any music in your film.
